

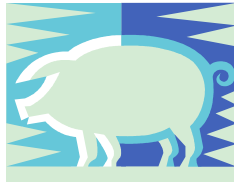

PIG PERFECT is the story of one man's passionate grail-quest for "the lost taste of pork." Cookbook author, naturalist, and lifelong "hamthropologist" Peter Kaminsky's pilgrimage leads him from an ancient village in Andalucia to a desert island off the Georgia coast and the last descendents of the pigs that Columbus brought to the Americas. Along the way he delves into the origins of pigs as a species and the work of the archeologist at the Great Pyramid of Menkaure who may have unlocked the mystery of the pork taboo.

For anyone interested in the pleasures of food and the rich lore of pigs, this journey through such wide-ranging topics as the last great country hams, the Dr. Seuss of Renaissance Spain, and the alchemy of flavor offers Kaminsky's trademark blend of wit, unforgettable characters, and the pursuit of pleasure.
